2016 EMERGENCY RELIEF PROGRAMME

Of the total 10.2 million people in need of food assistance as identified by the 2016 [Humanitarian Requirements Document](#) (HRD), the National Disaster Risk Management Commission (NDRMC), together with WFP, is assisting 7.6 million people. The remaining beneficiary caseload is covered by the Joint Emergency Operations Program (JEOP) NGO consortium.

HIGHLIGHTS

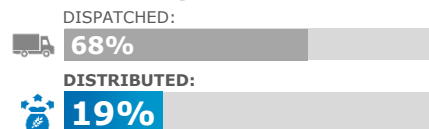
- **Round 1 of the 2016 emergency relief programme is complete.** Dispatches for Round 2 were completed on 10 May, and distributions are ongoing.
- **Overall, distributions continue to lag behind dispatches.** WFP has commenced dispatches for Round 4 in Somali region. Data from other operators are not yet available.
- **A complement to the 2016 HRD, the "Prioritization Statement", was released on 10 May.** The statement establishes revised food assistance needs until the end of the year at USD500 million.
- **Heavy rains continue to cause delays in dispatches of food to Food Distribution Points (FDPs),** especially in Somali region.

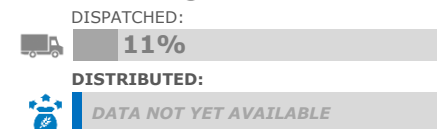

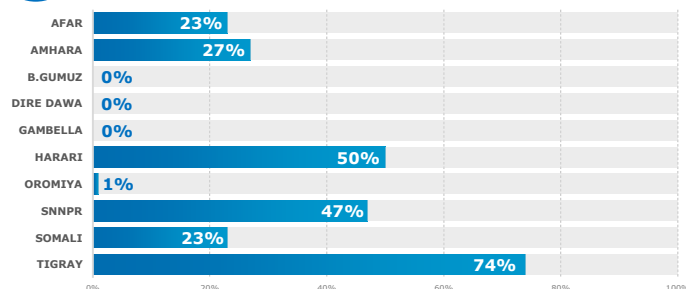

ROUND 3, AS OF 11 MAY 2016

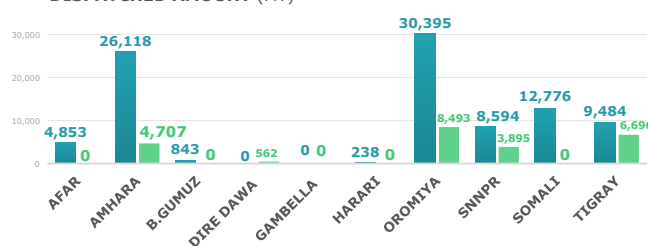


DISPATCH STATUS

ROUND 3, AS OF 11 MAY 2016

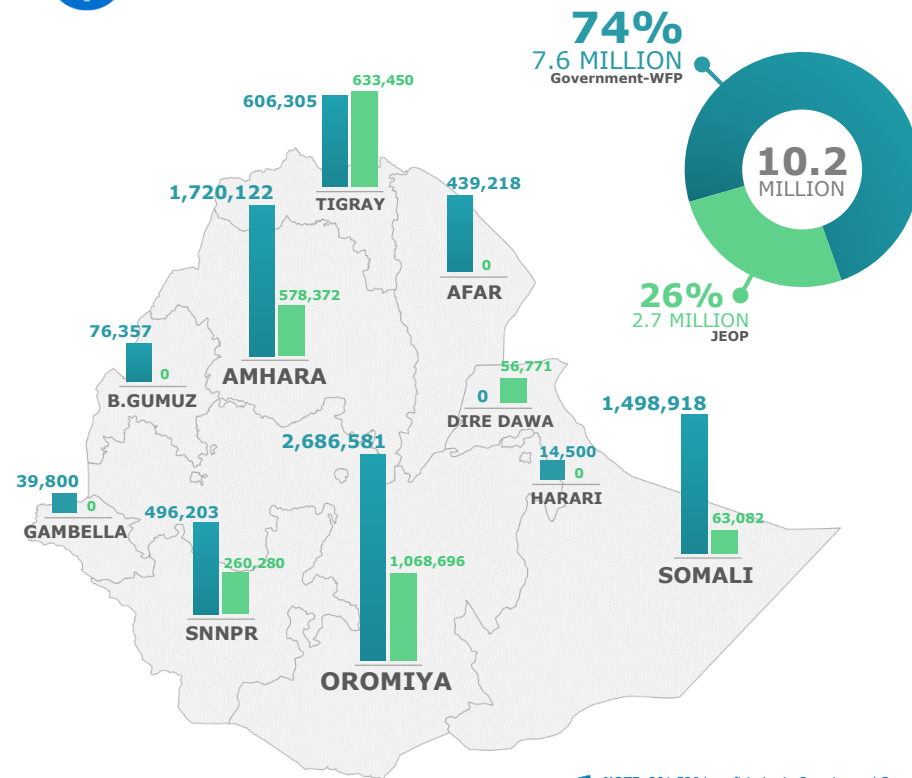


DISPATCHED AMOUNT (MT)
